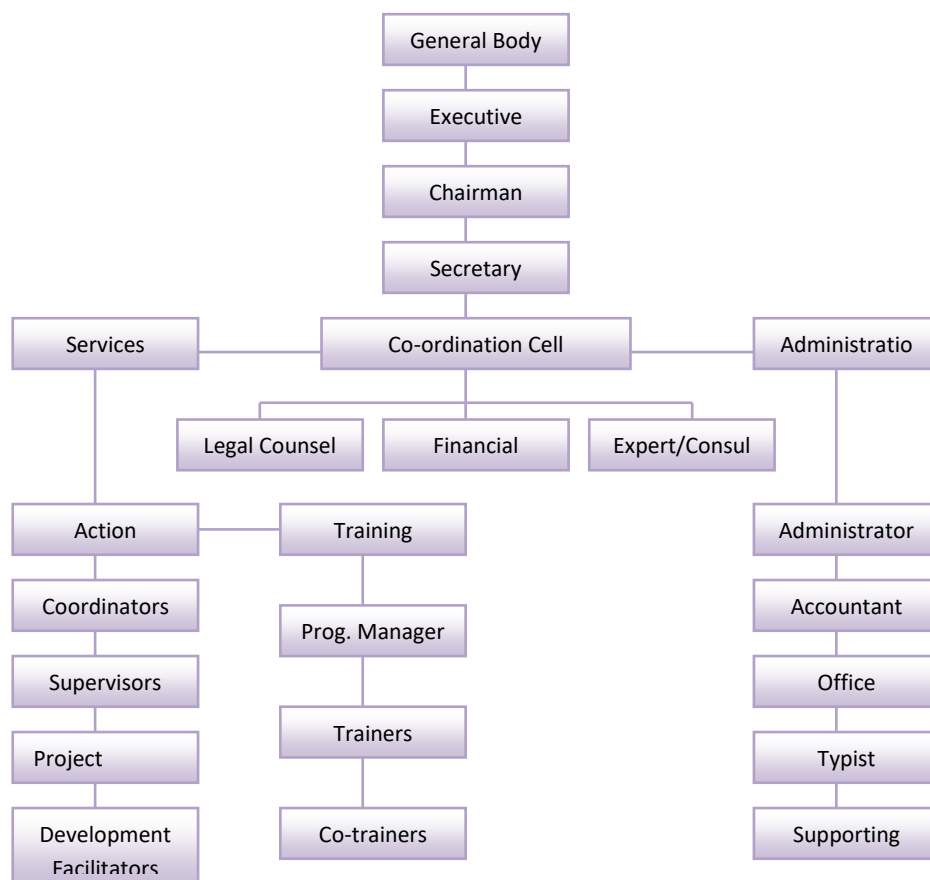
Constituency / history

MANAGEMENT OF HEALTH FACILITIES

In partnering with JSW Foundation we are managing two nos of health facilities at Nuagaon, Joda Block, Keonjhar & Narayanposi, Koida Block, Sundargarh with deployment of doctor and paramedical staff. The health facilities are providing quality preventive, curative health and occupational health care services which is complementing and supplementing the initiatives of both State & Union Government. Committed health team engaged in delivering quality health care services to the villagers and the floating population .JSW Foundation and Paribartan have jointly developed a comprehensive health service delivery plan (both institutional and outreach) to meet health and wellbeing needs of the population especially the poor and vulnerable sections of the mining operational area and beyond. . Till 25th of March 2022 , the cumulative patient load of the health facilities was 9831.

The following services are provided in these health facilities:

- Outpatient Services
- Emergency Medical Services
- Pharmacy to dispense medicines and consumables.
- Pathology Lab for basic diagnostic services
- Referral of critical patients
- IEC/BCC services
- Health Camp in the outreach areas

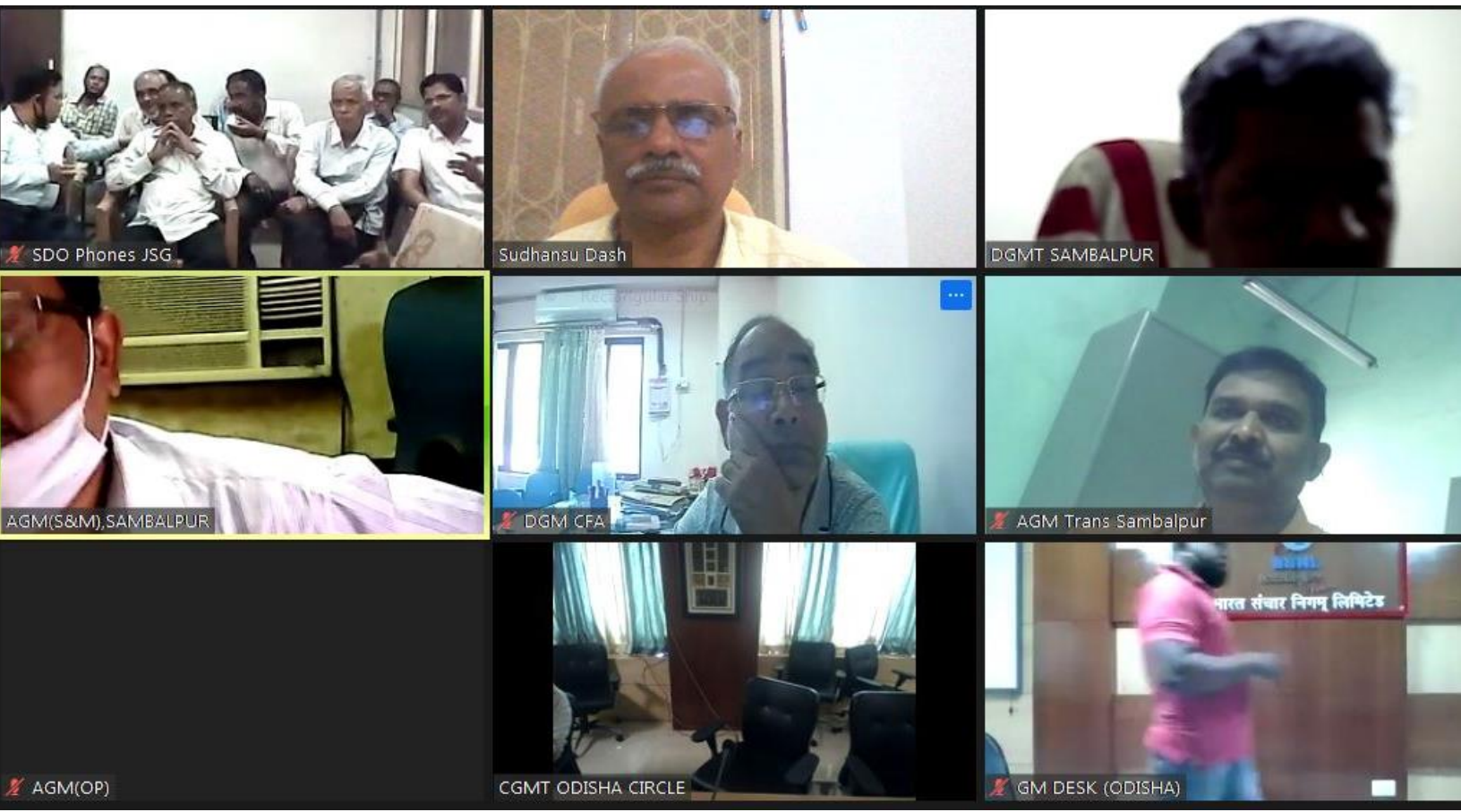

AMBULANCE SERVICES

MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT Cum AMBULANCE SERVICES is an intervention of PARIBARTAN in partnering with Mahindra Finance, India to address the primary health needs of the vulnerable populations mostly debarred to avail referral transport facility at the moment of need. One dedicated vehicle has been running across the operational area with the objectives to transport patients to the nearest facility. The MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT Cum AMBULANCE Transport facilities have been available round the clock to provide emergency health care services particularly for obstetric care, emergency newborn care also transport the complicated cases during pregnancy and childbirth to PHC/CHC/Health institutions. 63 serious patients were transported to health facility.



COMMON FACILITY CENTRE (CFC) FOR BERHAMPUR HANDLOOM (PATTA) CLUSTER, GANJAM UNDER SFURTI, Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India

PARIBARTAN has been fortunate to be the Implementing Agency by Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India to facilitate for establishment of Common Facility Centre (CFC) for Berhampur Handloom (*Patta*) cluster under SFURTI programme. The main objectives of the programme are to strengthen Common Facility Centres (for testing, training, raw material depot, effluent treatment, complementing production processes). Paribartan, as implementing agency, has an objective to increase the livelihood & income activities of the weavers by enhancing their capacity, productivity, collective approach and infrastructural support under the proposed interventions. The project is likely to impact progressively at least 500 patta weavers, Out of those 400 women and 100 men weavers. The cluster project is supported by Institute of Entrepreneurship Development, Odisha (IEDO) as Nodal Agency and Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII) as Technical Agency and the duration is 2019-2022.



MOU WITH BERHAMPUR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION

Paribartan signed a MoU with BeMC to manage the Patta Hub . In both the centers the handlooms and the machineries are in operation and women are regularly engaged in weaving of *Patta and Jattha* . We are unable to utilize the machines fully because of shortage of raw materials and working capital . Since March 2022, totally 123 *patta sarees* and 10 *Jattha* produced . It is realized there is a huge demand of Patta saree and patta materials in domestic as well as outside market and we never



faced any difficulties of selling the materials. We received orders from Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal and one partner from have visited twice and very soon we are going to enter one MoU for production and marketing support. The total cost of a patta saree is around Rs 8500 to Rs 12500/-.We are selling the sarees with a minimum profit of Rs 500 to Rs1000. At the CFC the weavers are getting benefit of making design, coloring, and automatic drying .

BRAND BUILDING AND PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR PATTA SAREE AND DRESS

MATERIALS-

The Berhampuri handloom products especially *Patta saree & Patta* product have a distinct place in the world of fabrics. The IA and SVP meticulously designed and developed a strategic plan for capturing a good opportunity for marketing of the products. The objective of the activity is to promote the marketing channels in domestic as well as export market and bring about linkage between the two in a holistic and integrated manner. Negotiation has been going on with online market leaders , the e-commerce platform for selling the products .This apart in partnering with Berhampur Municipal corporation a mega sales counter was inaugurated and the weavers were encouraged to participate in market fair and planning to organize small sales during local fest and events. Also individual designer and expo houses are invited to see the products which will boost the sales.

PRE SCHOOL NUTRITION & EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Paribartan, with support of Jiv Daya Foundation supporting pre-school children (7months to within 60 months) in 5 villages. The purpose of this activity - Preschool –Nutrition and Education, started in 5 villages, covering 236 children since Dec- 2021. Milk and biscuits provision for children (from 7 months up to 60 months). We focus on the most effective option of preventing and correcting malnourishment in children by provision of Milk. The purpose of this activity aims to support villages not only to ensure that children receive adequate daily nourishment through milk, but also to engage in the learning activities to impact their overall health and wellbeing. Five numbers of volunteers are delivering education to the children and monitoring the hand hygiene practices regularly.



RAHAT (DRY RATION)DISTRIBUTION

In the 5 programme villages all most all households were faced food insecurity even unable to meet the food and nutrition requirement of their family. At this critical moment of Covid -19 , It is essential for ensuring food supply to tribal families ,daily wagers and ultra poor who have not the work for a prolong period as a consequences of COVID-19 pandemic. As it takes time for normalcy resume, Jiv Daya Foundation was approached by Paribartan Pallahara, Angul, Odisha, India for reaching with relief items – Dry Ration to enable the ultra poor to tide out the pandemic situation furthering minimize long term consequences on their lives and livelihood.On 6th October 2021 it was raining, volunteers transported the rice bags to Jenaposi village. It was decided to distribute the food packs and sanitation packs to PWDs, the mothers having children and the elderly persons as per the list at their door step. Distribution process started at 7 am. Ward member was requested to flag off and delivered the packs. Identity proof was verified in accordance with the list collected earlier and 240 poorest among the poor families received the Food Packs and Hygiene Kits.

Laugh in her leaps- “RAHAT”

It was very calm and quite of 29th morning of March 2022. Volunteers loitering hither & thither and arranged every things in order. The lock down and shutdown followed by various restriction on movement impacted severely on the wage earners and they are unable to earn their livelihood. As a result, the health and nutrition requirement of wage earners and their family members remains unmet.

One among the wage earners, Sombari Naik of Rayadihi village, having 5 children, is staying in a tiny thatched house. She has no land and Sombari & her husband Kuja engaged in bamboo work and sale the products at local weekly *hatt*. During regular visit, our volunteer met with Sombari and found that she is unable to meet the food and nutrition requirements of her family. She described the plight of her family

and explained how she was confined inside the four wall of his home during lockdown and unable to purchase food and ration item from the market, as she didn't have any money.





Sombari after receiving the ration pack expressed her gratitude –

“Let’s say 29th March’ 2022 a good day for me and I am comfortable to manage my requirement at least for a month. May God bless them- Jiv Daya Foundation & Team PARIBARTAN. I am thankful.”

RESPONDING TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

PARIBARTAN has taken quick initiatives at the forefront of the COVID-19 response worked closely with Government, Corporate, Donor and Local self government . From the outset in partnering with donor and corporate bodies started operation to help vulnerable people they go through the hardship . We were conducting awareness sessions on safety norms and the promotion of masks by providing over 150,000 masks, as well as organizing social distancing and hand wash demonstrations amongst frontline workers. Paribartan was reaching out to persons with disabilities, skilled weavers, migrant workers single women households, farmers, elderly, , sex workers and other vulnerable groups. 1970 food packs and sanitation kits distributed.

We are reaching out to persons with disabilities, skilled weavers, migrant workers, single women households, farmers, elderly, sex workers and other vulnerable groups.

Our work includes:

- ❖ 2970 food packs and sanitation kits distributed.
- ❖ SHG supported on Face Mask preparation and liaise with business hubs for marketing of the same
- ❖ 150000 Face Mask Distributed
- ❖ PPE KITs supplied to health functionaries in consultation with the district administration

- ❖ Oxygen concentrators, BiPAP machine, supplied to the district health administration
- ❖ Three ambulances were supplied to Government Health Facility for referral transport of patients

AMBULANCES

3 numbers of ambulances were presented to Sub divisional health facility (one ambulance to Sub district hospital, Wankaner, Gujrat and two ambulances to Sub divisional hospital Durgapur, West Bengal) as part of its ongoing initiatives towards the Covid-19 relief efforts in India. The donation was in recognition of the efforts of the State government in combating the pandemic and will be useful for reaching out to patients in rural and remote areas and comfortably moving them to the nearest hospitals. The ambulance will contribute to transporting of persons infected with the disease for treatment to health facility and referring to secondary and tertiary health facilities in emergency besides for boosting the state's testing capacity and for contact tracing.

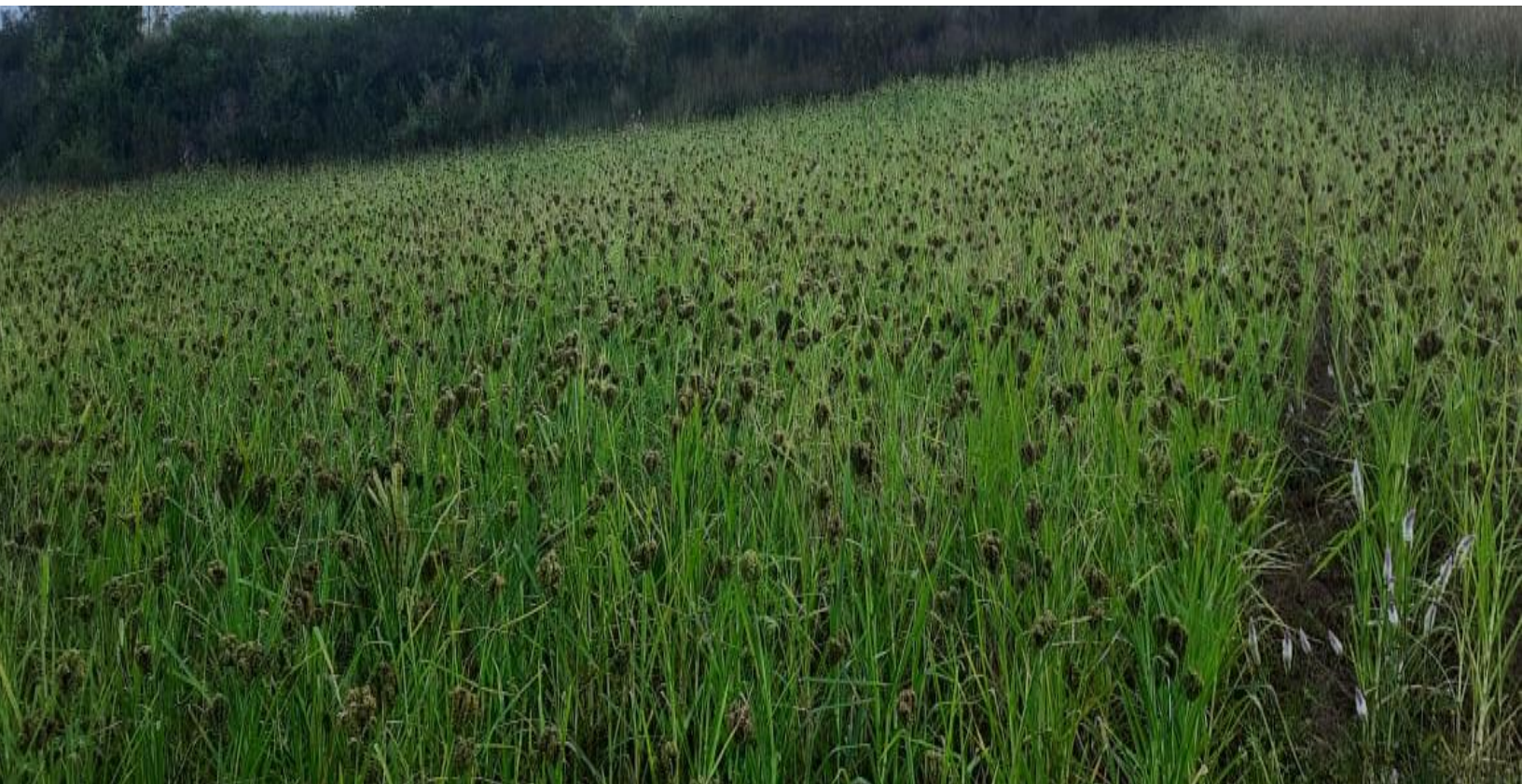


CONSERVATION OF ENDANGER MEDICINAL PLANTS.

In- situ conservation of endanger medicinal plants, as one of the outcome of the regular not stop sensitization work of the targeted development partners and the non targeted development partners collectively involved in conservation of endangered medicinal plant species available in the forest area. In collaboration with the line forest department the villagers are taking measures regarding the plantation and protection of medicinal plant species in their own habitat. Paribartan the agency successfully organized training programmes for the representatives of Narisanghas on sustainable and judicious collection of seeds, regeneration techniques using matured seeds, cutting of medicinal plants, treatment and on processing and preservation techniques. Now it is a ways of life of the tribal women to take care of medicinal plant species. Also it is observed 60% of the tribal families are using paste, decoction and crude extraction of medicinal plant to treat their animal and livestock. The ethno-vetnary practices save the money also directly helping Adivasi to generate income out of the animal husbandry activities. The most important thing is that those practices clearly spell the changed behaviour and attitude of the tribal community for corrective measures towards eco-restoration and participation in management of natural forest and environment. The sensitized tribal are now coming forward for forest centered advocacy to safe guard their resource rights and to have access to their ancestral forest land which is a positive attitude for participation in management of natural forest and common community resources. No doubt this trend and practice will continue and forest will be one of the important benefactors to appease the needs and necessities of the isolated and most disadvantaged population.

PROMOTION OF SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURAL PRACTICE

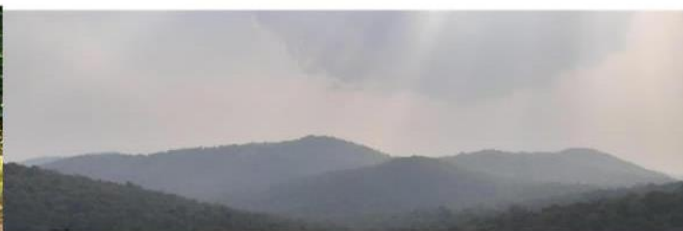
Agriculture continues to be primarily a subsistence activity. Paribartan is promoting crop intensification techniques to increase yield of small and marginal farmers through crop diversification, intercropping, organic manures for soil fertility while empowering farmers through information sharing and video dissemination. Paribartan as a local resource organization on draught resilient farming and on non elephant lure crop (crop raid by elephants is rampant) has been promoting ecological agriculture for more than 10 years believing that sustainable management of natural resources is the key to improved livelihoods, stable agricultural development as well as improved ecological balances. Agriculture is the primary occupation of the people of this area & they have been practicing diversified agricultural practices. Different types of pulses, millets, oilseeds, local vegetables, traditional varieties of paddy are cultivated here. Paribartan has been guiding marginal rain-fed farmers to manage their natural farm resources better, practice alternative eco-farming practices for enhanced yields and reduced costs. Paribartan intends to educate and empower the farmers with the latest eco – friendly technology, technical know-how and high quality affordable inputs so as to enhance average yield and make farming a sustainable venture.



INVENTORY FOR BIODIVERSITY OF BAMRA WILDLIFE DIVISION (BADRAMA AND KHALASUNI WILDLIFE SANCTUARY), ODISHA

Forest & Environment department Govt. of Odisha sanctioned a project to Paribartan (2021-22) titled as Inventory for biodiversity of Bamra wildlife division (Badrama and Khalasuni wildlife sanctuary), Odisha. Inventory is one of the important tasks for precise taxon-specific and area-specific conservation efforts and support to have adequate information about the biodiversity profile of the ecologically important areas and provide ample opportunities for rational planning..This also creates pace to address habitat fragmentation and consequent losses suffered by different population, ensuring the safety of the threatened biodiversity lying in the protected areas. The exact status of several species of animals in the Sanctuary is yet to be assessed. A team of researcher engaged in preparing the Inventory and the long range perspective plan on conservation of the flora & fauna of the Badrama and Khalasuni wildlife sanctuary .

PLANTATION OF FRUITS BEARING AND WILD PLANTS -“MISSION MILLION TREES”

Paribartan has forged partnership with Dinabandhu Trust , Kolkota & Capgemini to undertake massive plantation activities in Odisha to enhance vegetation coverage. Plantation activities play a vital role in



moderating micro climate, sequestering greenhouse gases (CO₂, etc.) and also in aiding the percolation of water. Trees of all kinds provide immeasurable ecosystem services, including carbon sequestration, continual replenishment of soil, and removal of pollutants from air and retaining/charging ground water table. Paribartan implemented a project “**Mission Million Trees**” and the duration is off 3 Years . 20000 saplings were planted in 4 blocks of 4 districts namely Pallahara block of Angul district, Kanas block of Puri district, Tirtol block of Jagatsinghpur district ,Bhubaneswar block of Khordha district and in Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation area. Community participation was ensured and they are taking lead role in watch and ward and for monitoring the health of the plants and it is agreed that Paribartan will be responsible for maximum survival of the plants.

AWARENESS RAISING FOR PREVENTION OF SPREAD OF HIV/ AIDS & STI

Project activities were implemented with funding support of Mercury Phoenix Trust. Project team engaged in delivering services as per road map and the timeline. This report entails regarding the progress made so far and its effect over the targeted audience from the start in May 2022 till October 2022. In implementing the project, Paribartan capitalized on its unique adolescent-led strategy targeting adolescents-in-school and adolescent-out-of school (mostly girls) with activities that included training of peer educators, providing SRH and life skills education, organize community level events/meetings on providing correct information on HIV/AIDS, its spreading and on how to control it as well as support each other in taking up health-seeking behaviour. During the project period it was verified that project activities were implemented at par with the timeline and there is enhanced in knowledge, attitude, behaviour and practices on HIV/AIDS and on its control and prevention.

CAMPAIGN ON HAND HYGIENE PRACTICES IN GANJAM DISTRICT

Clean hands mean good health for students, teachers, administrators and the entire school community. The problem is that for many people, especially school going children ,hand washing just isn't a priority. To encourage students and to encourage them to pass this information to their family and community about hand washing and its importance, Paribartan organized continuous school centred activities to make hand washing a habit. To improve health and hygiene, access to potable water and sanitation facilities in primary schools, activities focusing on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) was initiated . It is expected through promotion of correct hand-washing procedures, and education about why this is necessary, through child , families and members of the community will become more aware of the necessity and importance about hand-washing. Episodes of diarrhoea will be significantly decreased through this habit. Under this programme all villages of nos of teachers were trained on proper procedure of hand washing and its usefulness and regularly they are encouraging the student to change their behaviours and sustain the same.



CONSERVATION OF ASIAN ELEPHANT & THEIR HABITAT

Prevent traffic collisions by installing large reflective caution boards & lesser devices and community participation

Just like humans, animals too use their own 'roads' for their regular movement from one foraging or mating ground to another, within and between the forests which connect different habitats and are called 'corridors'. These corridors are frequently used by the traffic of elephants to move from one forage-rich habitat to another. Road and rail network of Dhenkanal and Angul districts passing through the elephant habitat is creating obstructions for free movement sometimes leading to painful accidents particularly elephants. . In partnering with Govt. of Odisha, local community elephant trackers regular co-ordination meetings , workshop and awareness program with local villagers, roadside motel/hotel (Dhaba) owners, truck drivers, forest, NHA and Railways officials are going on to mitigate painful accidents of elephants . The installation of modern lesser barricades at 4 locations to be installed to alert the drivers along the stretch at elephant crossing points on National Highway -55

This apart plantation with elephant friendly fruits bearing plants and favorite forage planting materials have successfully planted in Telkoi – Pallahara elephant corridor covering Keonjhar and Angul districts



SOURCES OF FUNDS

During the year 2021-2022, Paribartan mobilized and received financial support as grant and donation from Government, Corporate as well as foreign sources. The major share of domestic contributions came from private donors and from sale proceeds of organic agricultural farm produces, while government-supported agencies contributed to use their technical expertise for building capacity of the resource poor communities. This apart Paribartan's technical and professional services were utilized both by state and non state actors including CSOs for empowerment of the marginalized community.
